INSTRUCTIONS

- FEE(S):** Entry fee PER piece (sets considered one piece): \$20. Entry fees are non-refundable.
- FORM:** All information on paperwork must be clearly printed and legible. Send form, digital image(s) and entry fee(s) to:

- SUBMISSION** is by digital image only (images may be submitted on a CD or emailed to celisa@cowichecanyon.org).
 - Submit one image of each piece of artwork.
 - If submitting by CD, label CD with the artist's name and phone number.
 - Each image file may be no larger than 3 MB and saved as a jpeg file at 72 ppi resolution.
 - Each image file should be labeled with its Number - Last Name - Title.
 - Actual work must be identical to submitted images.
- ELIGIBILITY.** We will accept submissions in the following mediums: drawing, prints, fiber arts, painting, photography, mixed media. Work must have been completed within the past five years. No more than three entries per artist. Weight limit: may not exceed 75 pounds. Size limit: 4 feet by 4 feet per piece. We reserve the right to refuse artwork that is too fragile, oversized or does not meet conditions of eligibility. Artwork must be delivered ready to hang with hanging hardware installed on the back of the piece (rings on the left and right with wire in-between). Artwork without pre-installed hanging hardware will not be able to be displayed.
- PRICING.** A value or price must be stated on ALL work. Prices should reflect a 50-50 commission. Artists will receive 50% of each sale. 50% will be used to defray *A Hero's Life: Pollinators* community collaboration event expenses. No more than one "not for sale" (NFS) per artist. The value of the NFS item must be stated for insurance purposes.
- AFTERWARDS:** Artwork left longer than 30 days after the deadline for picking up work becomes the property of the collaboration.

EXHIBITION NOTES


The exhibit will be held at Essencia Bakery. This is a working bakery, with associated fluctuations in temperature and humidity. Normal care will be taken in installing pieces and maintaining the exhibit, however, participants acknowledge their awareness of the unique exhibit environment and that their submitted pieces have the capability to be exhibited in this environment for the described period of time without being adversely affected. *Pollinators: A Hero's Life* reserves the right to photograph exhibiting artwork for limited publicity purposes. Art must remain on exhibition throughout the designated schedule. Artists are responsible for delivery, pick-up of work and/or shipping costs. We cannot assume responsibility for loss or damage during shipment. Standard insurance coverage is provided during the exhibition.

COWICHE CANYON CONSERVANCY

Cowiche Canyon Conservancy (CCC) is a land trust working to protect shrub steppe habitat and connect people to our lands. CCC owns and manages 5,000 acres and offers 30 miles of non-motorized recreational trails through sage and grasslands, flowering meadows, oak woodlands and basalt cliffs.

These lands are home to an array of wildlife, including birds, mammals, reptiles, butterflies and other insects, some of which are dependent on this critical habitat for their survival.

Pollinators fertilize flowers by moving pollen from the male part (anther) of a flower to the female part stigma). Pollination results in seeds and fruits and the next generation of plants. Bees, wasps, butterflies, moths, hummingbirds and bats are some of the pollinators that carry pollen from one plant to another as they collect nectar.

These heroic pollinators play an extremely important role in our food supply, local economy and ecosystem.
